Are Drs. Elderkin and VandenBosch accepting new patients at Metro Health?

Yes, they are accepting new patients.

Where will their office be located?

Metro Health OB/GYN's main office is in the Metro Health Village near M-6 and Byron Center Avenue. Drs. Elderkin and VandenBosch will see patients at the main office located at 2221 Health Drive SW, Suite 2100 and also at Metro Health Southwest Plaza located at 2215 44th Street, both in Wyoming, MI.

What are their office hours?

Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Will I be able to continue seeing Dr. Renee Elderkin and Dr. Susan VandenBosch as my primary care physician?

Yes, with limited exception, you can expect your care with Drs. Elderkin and VandenBosch to be unchanged. However, at Metro Health our OB/GYNs are considered specialists. Therefore, if your insurance plan requires you to select a primary care physician (PCP), and you are not an OB patient of the practice, we ask that you look to a PCP for some aspects of your care. We encourage you to choose a Metro Health PCP who will work very closely with your OB/GYN physician to ensure coordination of care.
