Integrated Family Medicine -Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine Residency Program



Medical Education Department

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The Integrated Family Medicine - Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine Residency Program is housed in an offcampus ambulatory clinic building. The residency has a fully integrated curriculum/rotation and lecture program. There are two track options within the combined residency - obstetrics and sports medicine. Metro Health Hospital is associated with the Statewide Campus System formerly (COGMET) and Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine. This consortium provides ten monthly didactic meeting sessions in Lansing. Affiliated hospitals in Grand Rapids provide rotation flexibility and diversity for the Family Medicine rotations required by the residency and Michigan State University's Department of OMM provides support for the OMM rotations required by the residency along with didactic support.

General Program

Case-based learning/longitudinal patient care in the clinic setting. Both Family Medicine clinic and OMM clinic responsibilities are part of this program. Both clinics are in operation at the Breton Health Center.

- 2 months of General Surgery
- 3 months of Pediatrics
- 2 months of Emergency Medicine
- 3 months of Obstetrics/Gynecology
- 2 weeks of Radiology
- 2 months of Medicine
- 4 months of OMM per year

PGY 4 Family Medicine/NMM Requirements

- During the fourth year, residents continue with the requirements of their program or designated track.
- During the fourth year, residents participate in a two-day, off campus procedures workshop.
- The fourth year is also the time during which residents finalize their research paper. This paper is a requirement for successful completion of the residency. The paper is to be submitted for review by May of the graduation year.
